About the seminar:

"In place of colonialism, as the main instrument of imperialism, we have today neo-colonialism ... [which] like colonialism, is an attempt to export the social conflicts of the capitalist countries. ... Historical development of imperialism shown by e.g. Cecil Rhodes in Great Britain or Carl Peters in Germany, developed to a colonial dependency and exploitation of different parts of the world. Although many so-called former colonies gained independence after 1918 and 1945, many first world countries support strong political and economic relationships to those countries with neocolonial or even neoimperial tendencies.

Possible paper topics:

Multidimensional influences and dependencies in the past and the present e.g in the fields of art, culture, history, policy, economy, sociology and socio-economy.
